Levels 1, 2 and 3 Coaching Criteria

LEVEL 1 RIDER COACH

A coaching assistant **not** a stand alone coach





- Employed on a training yard and available to assist younger, less experienced members of staff.
- You will aid staff retention by offering advice and coaching to improve skills
- Understand when to refer a coaching query to a higher more qualified coach
- Coaching is covered by yard insurance as you are not covered to coach outside of your employment.
- Level 1 coaching qualification is the first qualification for those who do not yet hold a coaching certificate

LEVEL 2 RIDER COACH

- Qualified to coach without direct supervision
- Assists in delivery of regional yard training organised by RSDP is covered by RSDP insurance.
- With adequate insurance can freelance coach this must be organised by the coach.
- Prepare, deliver, and evaluate a series of coaching sessions
- Networks with other Level 3 and 2 coaches, roving instructors and trainers to ensure the coaching needs of the racing community are met.
- Liaises with stakeholders of the wider racing community such as parents of pony club participants, pony racing jockeys, amateur racing enthusiasts to ensure that coaching and training needs are met.

LEVEL 3 RIDER COACH

- A Level 3 coach is a fully autonomous coach able to plan, deliver, analyse and review annual programmes of development for riders.
- A role model for the racing industry
- Actively goal setting and delivering progressive coaching for a number of riders
- Mentoring and advising Level 1 and 2 coaches and encouraging others to join the rider coaching programme
- Organise and deliver regional training to work riders on training yards. Provide detailed feedback and action plan for rider development.
- Continually evaluating and developing personal coaching practice.
- With adequate insurance can freelance coach this must be organised by the coach.
